Greetings from Chiang Rai! After an extended summer break - thanks to Covid19 postponing the re-opening of school 3 times — the new term has finally started in the second week of July. Actually, when all the students had returned, their school suddenly announced they will close for two more weeks due to a local Covid case.





So, like everywhere else in the world right now, Covid19 has really made a difference to how we live, work and study. Luckily, neiahbour the local is health volunteer and she came in to remind the children and staff of the Covid regulations,

recommended they quarantine in the house for a week, with only the staff going out for shopping and errands. She also said we should not gather altogether as a group of 30 just yet. So, unfortunately, I have not yet been able to meet with all of the Ayui students as a group. Their school and colleges are doing online and/or worksheet assignments for now, with 2 of our college girls starting their internships. As a 'Welcome Back' gift in the time of Covid, I bought adjustable masks for all the students and staff.

Ampai Kindergarten, where I teach, started term earlier and when the school Director, Khun Chamrieng Bunmanon, heard that the Ayui children had returned but had to study at home for 2 weeks, she kindly offered to provide lunch and snacks for them for the first week.

This year, we accepted 2 new students - 14 year-old Kittika, who already attends the same school, and knows some of the Ayui girls. Her father died years ago, so her mother has been supporting her and her sibling. The new boy is 9 year-old Somdet, from the village we went to donate clothes to in December 2020. His mother asked if he could apply because they are a large, very poor family. They are both sponsored by Dylan Hartman in Australia.
