For the first time since we opened our doors in 2007, we had to cancel our Annual Clothes Donation because it was too risky. There was a worrying time when 2 of our younger students got Covid while back in their villages, and they had to stay at a government-appointed hotel for mild cases. It was the same place our housefather quarantined in, when he got Covid months ago. Thankfully, both students recovered and returned to Ayui at the start of the new year. All our staff, high school and college students have been vaccinated now, but not our 7 primary school students.



After New Year, it was nice to get a visit from an Ayui college graduate, Yohan, who is now a barber at an upscale barber shop. He first learned how to give haircuts while living at the Boys Home. Despite the frustrations of online learning and class closures, in March this year, 6 of our students will graduate from Grade 9 and stay at Ayui to study further at Vocational College, and 5 of our College students will graduate. One of them has decided to stay on at Ayui and study for her Higher Vocational College Certificate.
