July 2020 Chiang Rai, Thailand

Our last newsletter came out during our end-of-year Summer break...and then Covid19 happened. So, all the students were already back home in their villages with their families when lockdown, even high up in the mountain villages, started. Thailand is down to a few Covid cases (from Thais returning from overseas) and the government extended the school holidays for another month. So, the 2020 school year started July 1st



During May, after we had been on lockdown already for two months, I was contacted by my friend, Dave Comas, the President of the Chiang Mai Expats Club (CMEC) about the possibility of buying food items and distributing them among people here unemployed due to the Coronavirus, sharing funds donated to CMEC for this purpose. I used the CMEC donations to buy, pack and distribute: **a bag of dried/canned food items, a bag of fresh vegetables, a carton of 30 eggs and a 5kg pack of rice**.

The first distribution round was done at the Foundation, for 30 unemployed people, and the second round was done for 60 unemployed people at Wat Jed Yod Temple with my colleagues, staff of Ampai Kindergarten. All the beneficiaries were very grateful for the help, especially those with children to feed, and it was nice to be able to give back to the local community.
