The weekend after that, I took everyone out to *moo grata* (all-you-can-eat dinner) to thank them for their hard work cleaning up after the flood.







Loy Krathong

On Saturday, November 16th, 2024, we celebrated the annual Thai tradition of *Loy Kratong*, which was a new experience for our volunteers, and a favorite outing for the children. It is when *kratongs* are made (or bought), traditionally made of banana tree trunk slices. They are decorated with flowers and include an incense stick and a candle, and are floated on the river, to pay respect to the Goddess of Water on the full moon night. Nowadays, it



also includes an adjacent fairground, with games, food and shops. Before the children left for the river, they lit traditional floating lanterns, which are to float away in the night sky, along with any bad vibes from the past year.
